What is Kiwanis Holiday Lights?

This celebration of holiday lights for the Greater Mankato area is located in Sibley Park in Mankato, Minnesota. It builds on past traditions and promotes the communities we serve, while raising money and collecting non-perishable food donations for those in need. Admission is free for everyone. Non-perishable food and cash donations are accepted and appreciated. Please note, Kiwanis Holiday Lights only collects cash and food donations within the lights display area in Sibley Park. No other organizations or individuals have been approved to collect donations on behalf of Kiwanis Holiday Lights.

Kiwanis Holiday Lights is a project of the Kiwanis Club of Mankato.

The City of Mankato does not allow dogs in Sibley Park, but dogs are welcome to join you in your car as you drive through!

This event features strobe lights that may trigger seizures in some individuals.

History

The original Kiwanis Holiday Lights idea came from Kiwanis Holiday Lights President, Scott Wojcik. His hometown, Marshfield, Wisconsin, had a similar event, and he brought the idea to members of the Mankato Downtown Kiwanis Club who were looking for a fundraiser that would greatly impact the Mankato community. The key concept was that Kiwanis Holiday Lights would not only help promote Kiwanis as a whole, but also involve many other businesses and nonprofits from Greater Mankato. Preliminary planning started in the Spring 2011 and the idea appealed to many people, including the City of Mankato, who remembered the displays on Mary Circle and North Broad Street from past years. The official press release came out in June 2012. The Mankato Area Foundation and CHS were named as presenting partners, kick-starting the Kiwanis Holiday Lights capital campaign!

The mission of Kiwanis Holiday Lights is to create a celebration of holiday lights for the Greater Mankato Area that builds on past traditions and promotes the communities we serve, while raising money and collecting non-perishable food donations for those in need.



At the entrances to Sibley Park, Kiwanis Holiday Lights accepts donations in the form of cash and checks written out to Kiwanis Holiday Lights. The donations help cover operational costs, as well help support 70 nonprofits that provide volunteers to assist with set-up, tear-down and running the event each year.

Kiwanis Holiday Lights is 100% volunteer operated! Local nonprofit volunteer groups help with set-up, tear-down, and nightly duties during the event. Each volunteer group has the opportunity to enter a float in the opening night parade and decorate a tree in the "nonprofit tree area." In addition, these nonprofit organizations receive a portion of the donations received by Kiwanis Holiday Lights.

Since Kiwanis Holiday Lights started in 2012, over 16,700 volunteers from over 100 nonprofit organizations have participated with set-up, tear-down and running the event, logging over 100,000 volunteer hours.

Thanks to the donations that are provided by event attendees, \$590,000 has been donated to the nonprofit organizations that have provided volunteers.

It's not likely that anyone driving through Kiwanis Holiday Lights on any given night would recognize Rebeckah Maday for the power that she wields. Quiet and unassuming, she doesn't draw attention to herself.

But as the Volunteer Coordinator on the KHL Board of Directors, Rebeckah makes sure there are people on hand to help set up the displays before November 24 and that each night is fully staffed. That means working with all of the nonprofit organizations that provide service in exchange for a financial contribution.

She has worked on the event since year one when her Girl Scout troop volunteered as a way to raise money for a European trip. She and her family were asked to get more involved, and as a senior in college, she became KHL's first intern.

After co-chairing the volunteer position with Matt Norland, she was elected to the Board to fill the Volunteer Coordinator role, and she was then asked to be on the Executive Team. It's safe to say she is not quiet and unassuming.

"It's really cool to be a part of the community and to give back and see the smiles on everyone's faces as they come through the park to see the lights and to know that you're a part of that," says Maday. "And to see all of the organizations continue to operate through support from Kiwanis Holiday Lights."

It is still a family affair, with her mom, Lori, coordinating concessions and helping organize the opening night parade, her dad, Brad, helping with a bit of everything, including coordinating volunteers in the park, and her brother, Connor, who helps with the dancing lights and animations. As a family, they fulfill Ranger duties, coordinating the night's volunteers on Christmas Eve and work concessions on Christmas Day. It appears that being the Volunteer Coordinator is easier when your family makes up a good volunteer foundation.

Mike Neidt is an electronics engineer with Verizon and has characteristics that align perfectly for Kiwanis Holiday Lights: professional-level electronics skills, an interest in learning and getting involved, and a great team player.

"In 2012, the first year, I came down to the event. I had seen viral videos of the dancing lights and told my wife, 'I want to learn how to do that,'" says Neidt. "I went to the post-season tear down of lights and kept showing up." His dedication was rewarded with an invitation to come back the following year.

It was then that he met Mark Broman, the original lights programmer, and started gaining insight into what has become his passion and his position with Kiwanis Holiday Lights. He also worked with Kyle Mrozek, who oversaw the railroad trestle corner called "Dancing Lights." For the last five or six years, Neidt has been the go-to guy, taking ideas and making them happen, and typically more cost-effectively than if they were purchased pre-programmed.

When the team found a French display of lights that appeared to flow into a canal, Neidt created the same effect going downhill from the CHS Gazebo. That led to the creation of presents made of PVC pipes and the oversized gift box near the Giving Barn where people can take pictures.

At the heart of it all is "Dancing Lights." When Neidt started working with Broman, he said it took about 40 hours to program a three-minute song. Now, in part because he belongs to some online groups and because programs can be shared, production time is cut to 20–30 hours. Still a long time but greatly reduced.

But time flies to a man who loves what he does. "I just enjoy doing this," he says. "The turn-up night is stressful but once the lights are on it's magical for me."
